## **Lambertville Academy to offer five two-week camp sessions**

LAMBERTVILLE—In addition to its regularly scheduled child care programs, Lambertville Academy also offers five two-week camp sessions for children kindergarten through 14 years of age.

Breakfast, lunch and snacks are provided. Children are grouped by appropriate age and ability.

Summer camp students participate in a variety of project-oriented lessons including:

- **Art projects such as painting, papier mache, drawing, pottery and printmaking**
- **Arts and crafts such as gimp, jewelry and quilts**
- **Cooking demonstration, instruction and participation**
- **Computers and educational software**
- **Hands-on gardening and identification of plants**
- **Science projects and discovery and bug collecting**
- **Games Outdoor games with water**
- **Sports**
- **Music and theater**
- **Hikes and canal walks and trips to the river**

There also will be quiet time and food.

At the end of each session, there is a Parents Night to show the things children have learned and made and so everyone can meet.

Children may attend one or more sessions. Each session will be different.

Session I will be June 23 to July 3. Session II is July 8-18. Session III is July 21 to Aug. 1. Session IV is Aug. 4-15. Session V is Aug. 18-29.

Camp project activities will run from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., but enrollment

entitles each child to attend from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Tuition is \$370 per session. There is a registration fee of \$25 and an education fee of \$50. Children enrolled in more than one session only pay the registration and education fees once.

Breakfast is served until 8 a.m. Lunch is served at 12:45. Snacks are served once in the morning and once in the afternoon.

The Elvin K. Smith Memorial Hall is air-conditioned and handicapped accessible.
